SITUATION REPORT

INCIDENT NAME: F/V Exodus Explorer

SITREP #: 3

SPILL NUMBER: 07259907701

LEDGER CODE: Requested

TIME/DATE OF SPILL: 2:02 AM on March 18, 2007. The USCG reported the spill to ADEC at 5:32 AM on March 18, 2007.

TIME/DATE OF SITUATION REPORT: 12:00 PM on March 27, 2007.

TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT: As the situation warrants

TYPE/AMOUNT OF PRODUCT SPILLED: The quantity of fuel released is unknown. The vessel operator reported to the Coast Guard (USCG) that the vessel was carrying 2500-3000 gallons of diesel fuel. The vessel was also carrying 35,000 pounds of cod.

LOCATION: Gannet Rocks in Kuluk Bay near Adak, 51.8721°N, 176.6183°W.

CAUSE OF SPILL: The vessel ran aground on Gannet Rocks.

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBLE PARTY (PRP): B & N Fisheries. Captain Dan Carney

RESPONSE ACTION: The salvage team completed the lightering of the vessel by 10 am on Monday, March 26, 2007. A total of 4,299 gallons of diesel and 443 gallons of mixed diesel and water were transferred from the Exodus Explorer to the vessel Intrepid Explorer. The vessel's trawling net was removed to avoid possible risks to marine life near the vessel. The salvage team is currently assessing whether to remove jelled hydraulic oil from the vessel.

The salvage team welded a patch over the 14" by 24" hole near the port engine room of the vessel.

The salvage team will be installing air fittings to the vessel to re-float the vessel as soon as the weather conditions improve near the vessel. Once the vessel is stabilized in its present upside down position, it will be towed to the proposed disposal location at 52 degrees 14 minutes north, 176 degrees 30 minutes west. This position is 14.14 nautical miles northwest of the northernmost tip of Great Sitkin Island (Swallow Head), in 1753 fathoms of water.

Other than the initial reporting of oil sheen during the grounding, no further oil sheen observations have been reported. Three hundred feet of boom is around the vessel and regularly maintained by the salvage team.

SOURCE CONTROL: Fuel removed from vessel.

RESOURCES AFFECTED: The waters of Kuluk Bay due to sheen observed. No oiled wildlife has been reported.

FUTURE PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: The USCG, EPA, ADEC and PRP representatives are coordinating on the most suitable weather conditions for safely re-floating, towing and scuttling the vessel.

WEATHER: Today: SE winds 25 knots increasing to 40 knots in the afternoon, seas 13 feet. Wednesday: S winds 35 knots becoming SW 20 knots in the afternoon, seas 14 feet.
