SITUATION REPORT

INCIDENT NAME: F/V *Windward*

SITREP #: 1 & Final

SPILL NUMBER: 07229915401

LEDGER CODE: not requested

TIME/DATE OF INCIDENT: The F/V *Windward* struck a rock near Goose Island at approximately 8:40 PM on June 3, 2007. The operator reported the vessel's status to ADEC at 10:30 PM on June 3, 2007.

TIME/DATE OF SITUATION REPORT: 11:00 AM June 4, 2007.

TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT: This is the final report.

TYPE/AMOUNT OF PRODUCT SPILLED: The operator estimated that less than 300 gallons of diesel fuel was released after a fuel tank was ruptured by the struck rock.

LOCATION: Goose Island in Prince William Sound. The reported location is 60° 43' N, 146° 43' W.

CAUSE OF SPILL: The cause was reportedly due to human error when the helmsman fell asleep and the vessel struck a rock near Goose Island in Prince William Sound.

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBLE PARTY (PRP): Point Five, Inc. Warrendale, OR

RESPONSE ACTIONS: The crew was able to transfer some fuel from the damaged 2000 gallon tank but estimated that 300 gallons of diesel was released following the vessel striking the rock. A 400' x 60' sheen was reported at the scene when reported to ADEC. The vessel continued under its own power to Valdez and arrived there at approximately 9:00 AM on June 4, 2007. No further sheen was observed during the transit to Valdez.

SOURCE CONTROL: The fuel was transferred from the damaged tank.

RESOURCES AFFECTED: Marine waters of Prince William Sound near Goose Island. No oiled wildlife has been observed.

FUTURE PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: The vessel arrived in Valdez at approximately 9:00 AM June 4, 2007. The damaged tank was reported to contain approximately three feet of sea water and one inch of residual fuel which the operator plans to remove. The vessel will be assessed at low tide and a temporary patch applied with permanent repairs to be completed as soon as possible so the vessel can return to service.

WEATHER: Today light winds, cloudy with a chance of rain, highs in the mid 50s to lower 60s.
