SITUATION REPORT

INCIDENT NAME: Aerofuel Truck Rollover **SITREP #:** 2

TIME/DATE OF SPILL: 11:45 AM on October 19, 2011

TIME/DATE OF SITUATION REPORT: 3:00 PM on October 24, 2011

TIME/DATE OF THE NEXT REPORT: As the situation warrants

TYPE/AMOUNT OF PRODUCT SPILLED: Alaska Aerofuel estimates approximately 2,550 gallons of #2 minus 15 gallons heating oil (a blend of #1 and #2 heating oils used during the winter in Fairbanks) were spilled during the incident.

LOCATION: The spill occurred on Easy Street, about half a mile south of the Old Richardson Highway in Fairbanks.

CAUSE OF SPILL: The spill was caused when the driver lost control of his truck on icy road conditions, hit a curb and rolled the truck on its side. A seam on the top of the tank failed and the fuel continued to spill until the truck was pulled upright at approximately 12:40 PM.

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBLE PARTY (PRP): Alaska Aerofuel Inc.

RESPONSE ACTION: Approximately 260 cubic yards of contaminated soil were removed from the site and taken to a local thermal remediation facility. Work will continue until soil contamination has been removed and the site characterized by an environmental consulting firm. Response resources consist of an excavator, loader and semi-side dump trucks. The excavation area was backfilled after the confirmation soil sample collected from the excavation area showed analytical results were below ADEC's cleanup criteria. Road closure remains in effect as cleanup progresses through the affected area. ADEC has an on-site representative monitoring the cleanup. Two environmental scientists are on site for field screening and analytical sampling. Three Central Environmental, Inc. CEI responders continue the cleanup, operating during daylight hours. The truck has been removed from the site.

ADEC Drinking Water program specialists identified the drinking water wells within proximity of the incident and have evaluated potential receptors. The surrounding residential neighborhood is supplied by "City" water.

SOURCE CONTROL: The truck was righted and removed from the incident location.

RESOURCES AFFECTED: There is a possibility that groundwater will be affected. The roadway right-of-way at the incident location has been affected.

FUTURE PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: ADEC will continue to monitor the excavation activities along the sides of the road, and coordinate the review of site characterization and rehabilitation plans developed by the responsible party. Groundwater monitoring wells may be installed this season to establish groundwater data. Excavation of contaminated soil will continue in the right-of-way.

WEATHER: Overcast skies, approximately 24 degrees F, calm.
