
The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) has completed its review of the Notice of Intent (NOI) for the *Norwegian Pearl* to discharge wastewater under the Large Commercial Passenger Vessel Wastewater Discharge General Permit (GP) No 2009DB0026 and is issuing the enclosed authorization 2009DB0026-0003.

DEC reviewed the Notice of Intent and the Vessel Specific Sampling Plan (VSSP) that Norwegian Cruise Line submitted on April 29, 2010 for the *Norwegian Pearl*. Based upon that review, the *Norwegian Pearl* has been authorized for underway discharge of treated wastewater into Alaska marine waters. The *Norwegian Pearl* must take samples and meet the effluent limits found in Table 1 and Table 5 of the GP. All other permit conditions and deadlines must also be met.

Any person who disagrees with this decision may request an adjudicatory hearing in accordance with 18 AAC 15.195 - 18 AAC 15.340 or an informal review by the Division Director in accordance with 18 AAC 15.185. Informal review requests must be delivered to the Director of Water, 555 Cordova Street, Anchorage, Alaska 99501, within 15 days of receipt of the permit decision. Adjudicatory hearing requests must be delivered to the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Conservation, 410 Willoughby Ave., Suite 303, P.O. Box 111800, Juneau, Alaska 99811-1800, within 30 days from the date of the permit decision. If a hearing is not requested within 30 days, the right to appeal is waived.




